The proliferation of Kollelim in recent decades is testimony to the awareness of the need to prepare scholars, capable of undertaking the mantle of leadership. With the study of Torah being conducted in serious and dedicated scholarship the world over, the sound of Torah is now being revitalized, gaining momentum and strength. Kollel Toras Chaim is at the forefront of preparing a cadre of leaders for the future.

Every

morning, a group of highly motivated and devoted young scholars meet to continue their ongoing and rigorous study of Gemarah. An aura of discipline and seriousness pervades the Beis Medrash. Punctuality and accountability guide these men in their pursuit of academic excellence. They realize that their responsibilities include not only meeting their own scholarly pursuits, but they must also prepare to fulfill the needs of the community. People who are preparing for a future of leadership must follow the manner of great people. Accountability and attention to detail are hallmarks of a disciplined and serious scholar.

The pace of study is rigorous and challenging and is intended for young men who can maintain an intensive learning schedule. Gemarah and commentaries are studied at a very high and comprehensive level. Students are required to complete a full page every day, and are tested every month. The Rosh Kollel's weekly shiur reviews the high points of the material being studied, and offers students the opportunity to share their insights and understanding. The Kollel encourages independent study and original thought. Students are required to present a "chabura" reflecting their own novel approaches and ideas. These "mini theses" are published at the conclusion of the tractate. This rigorous and challenging program helps prepare our students for their roles as leading Torah scholars.

Kollel Toras Chaim was founded by Rabbi Mordechai Levine who has devoted his life to the study and dissemination of Torah. A talmid of Harav Hagaon R' Chaim Pinchas Sheinberg shlita, for over two decades, Rabbi Levine collected, edited and published the Rosh Hayeshiva's novellae on the nine tractates which are studied in Yeshivas Torah Ore. Rabbi Levine established Kollel Toras Chaim in 2003.
